III. AESD Network Updates - Lead: Tim Merlino

#### **Strategic relationships:**

- Revising partnership agreement with OSPI and are developing 22-23 program agreements with cabinet level leadership
  - 1. Draft expected by June 2022
  - Provide expectations around goal setting and accountabilities around statewide initiatives
- Statewide COVID Testing and Mitigation Supports for Districts
  - 1. Partnership with WA State Dept of Health, OSPI, and Health Commons
- Considering continuation of supports in the 22/23 year
- No-cost extension of funds. Will know within 2 weeks if we can keep covid testing employees on. Working to maintain ESD staff for at least another year
- Early Learning (Prenatal Grade 3) System Supports
  - 1. Partnership with OSPI, DCYF, Child Care Aware, Community Providers
- Integrated Pre-K Alignment and Coordinated Recruitment & Enrollment Support

- Age 4 can start kindergarten early. Needs to align with other Early learning programs. Working with ESDs to expand transitional kindergarten. Hoping for additional funding over time to fund these positions
- Region 16 Comprehensive Center
  - 1. Partnership with Oregon Association of ESDs and Alaska South East Regional Resource Center
- Each state has a service plan partnered with ESD members.
- Community of Steward Network: Engaging ESD leadership with this partnership
