Intersession

What do we do?

We offer K-8
instruction 4 days
per intersession
with a field trip on
the 4th day.
9-12 can do credit
retrieval remotely.

How do we fund it?

We had the Balanced Calendar grant, but with that funding pulled back, we used Title 1 funding for the October intersession. Each intersession costs about \$20,000, but with a few cuts and braided funding, we were able to cut it back to about \$14,000.

How do we staff it?

Staff are paid per diem to work intersession. They sign up by indicating they are interested in working through a survey.

Student Growth

Students that attended all 3 intersessions had more growth than students that didn't.



We can provide 3 intersessions and 4 weeks of summer school. That is 7 additional weeks of learning.

Pros Cons

Additional Cost

Each intersession can cost up to \$20,000 for staff, transportation, supplies, and admin costs.

More Transitions

some students don't do well with each transition due to breaks and we have 4 of them.

Limited Staff

We have between 35-40% of students sign up for intersession, but only about 10% of staff.

Supporting Families

Additional 7 weeks of education, childcare, and meals.
